Take a break from Noon – 1 p.m. while listening to music on the front lawn of Benson Memorial Library (213 N. Franklin St.). While in Titusville, stroll through the downtown, snap a selfie in the gazebo in Scheide Park, and have lunch while safely storing your bicycles at Brown's Primitive Sentiments (110 S. Washington St.), a bicycle friendly shoppe "where the tea is always brewing."

Before you head south, visit Perry Street Train Station, the northern stop for the Oil Creek & Titusville Railroad. Father's Day weekend offers miniature train displays, vendors, shopping and more.
